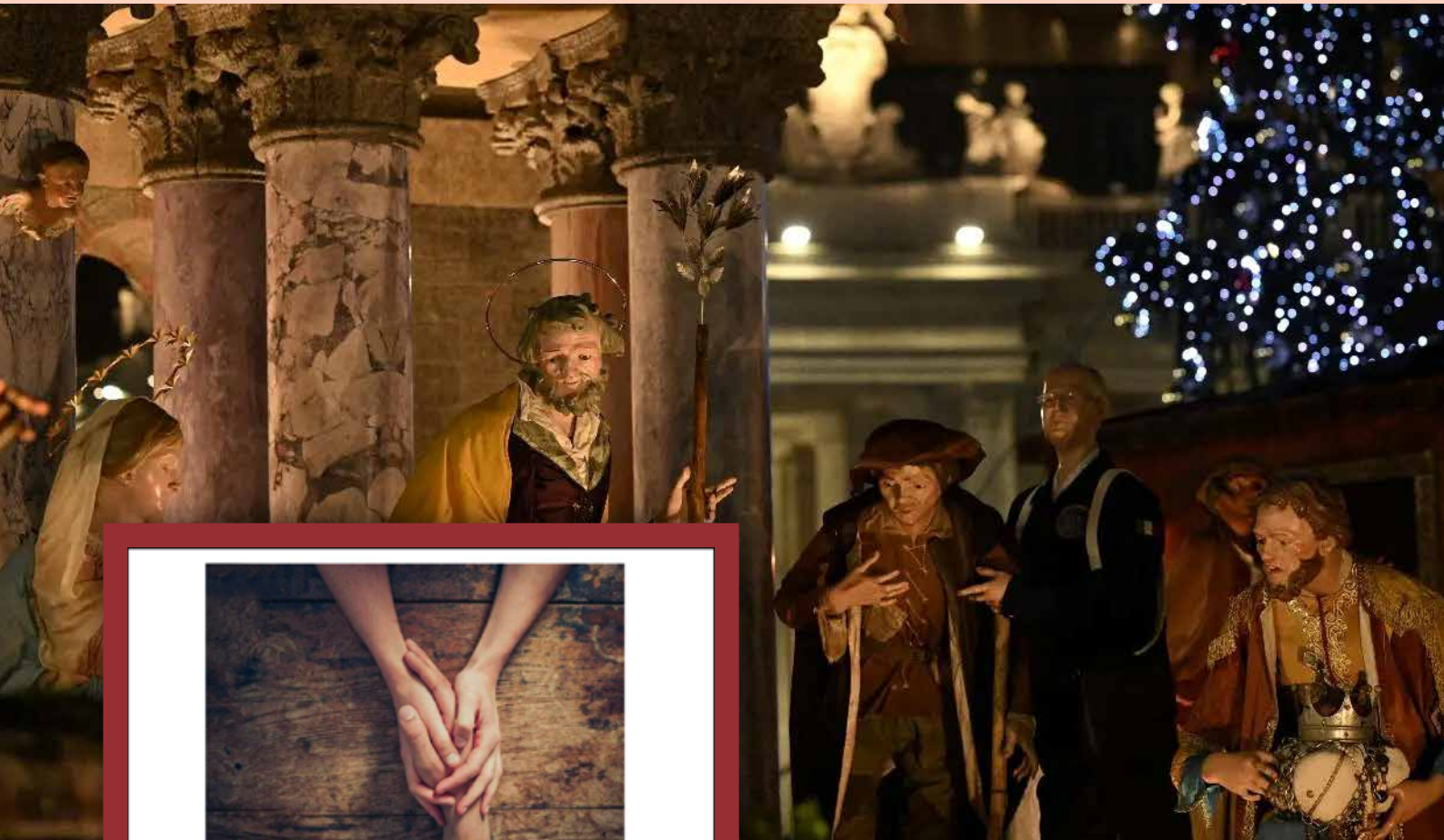

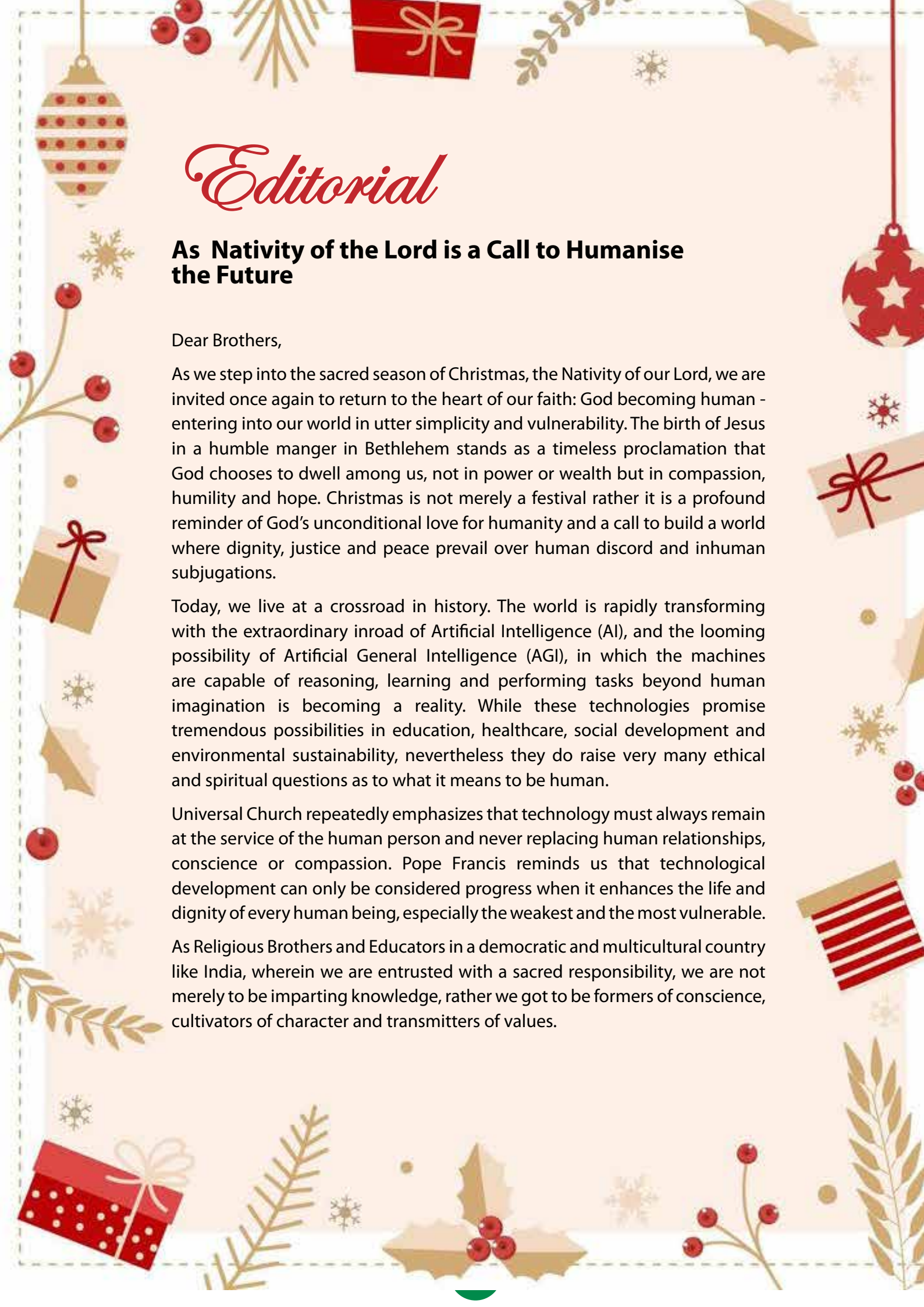

Editorial

Dear Brothers,

As we step into the sacred season of Christmas, the Nativity of our Lord, we are invited once again to return to the heart of our faith: God becoming human - entering into our world in utter simplicity and vulnerability. The birth of Jesus in a humble manger in Bethlehem stands as a timeless proclamation that God chooses to dwell among us, not in power or wealth but in compassion, humility and hope. Christmas is not merely a festival rather it is a profound reminder of God's unconditional love for humanity and a call to build a world where dignity, justice and peace prevail over human discord and inhuman subjugations.

Today, we live at a crossroad in history. 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I. The Paradoxical Nature Of Christian Faith (It's All at OUR Attitudinal Level)

INTRODUCTION: Faith is like a radar that sees through the fog the reality of things at a distance that a human eye cannot see. Faith sees the invisible, believes the incredible, and receives the impossible. The Bible challenges us (in 2 Corinthians 5:7) to "walk by faith, not by sight."

A. FLOW OF LIFE IN FAITH: So what is faith? John Spaulding said, "Your faith is what you believe, not what you know." Alexis Carrel observes, "It is faith, and not reason, which impels men to action. . . . Intelligence is content to point out the road, but never drives along it." I also agree with Blaise Pascal: "Faith is a sounder guide than reason. Reason can only go so far, but faith has no limits." At times faith is believing what you see isn't so. That's why the Bible says, "Faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen" (Hebrews 11:1)

Put faith to work when doubting would be easier. Faith is the anchor of the soul, the stimulus to action and the incentive to achievement. Faith will never abandon you; only you can abandon it. Nothing but faith can accurately guide your life. Faith gives us the courage to face the present with confidence and the future with expectancy. It is usually not so much the greatness of our troubles as the smallness of our faith that causes us to stop or complain.

As your faith grows, you will find that you no longer need to have a sense of control. Things will flow as God wills, and you will be able to flow with them to your great happiness and benefit.

B. IT'S PARADOXICAL NATURE: We may thus reflect on the **paradoxical nature of christian faith**. **Christian faith** is rational, but at the same time it is supra-rational. Of course, reason does its function. But the ultimate understanding of faith is not based on the light of one's natural reasoning, but on the evidence of the salvation-event which irresistibly appeals to one's mind and heart. We may call this **grace**. It is this supernatural force that is responsible for a truly Christian authentic life. It is not to be sought in intellectual argumentation, nor is to be explained in terms of pure rationality. The Christian faith is rather a response, a commitment to the call of God revealing Himself in history. The superluminosity, with which the salvation event speaks, surpasses the power of human intellect and thus may seem to be 'dark'. In this sense the acceptance of faith may be termed as '**a leap into darkness**'. However, the commitment made to the Absolute, being a commitment of one's entire being, should also include one's rationality. Hence the Christian faith, though it is beyond reason, is in no way against reason. Reason finds its high realization in the acceptance of mystery.

CONCLUSION: How profound it is, when said: "St. Francis's response to the Gospel came from a heart of faith, and not a head full of facts".

Over the last few months, our school community children, parents, staff, Brothers, Collaborators and benefactors has stood together through moments of joy and moments of crisis.

Visit of the Provincial Superior:



On 9 September, Rev. Bro. Shajan Antony, Provincial Superior, made his Canonical Visit to our community and school. He was received with affection by our children, who welcomed him with flowers and cheerful smiles. Brother Shajan visited all our centres and interacted freely with the students, especially the Class 10 batch. His message of motivation to work hard and encouraged them to dream high, remain disciplined, and aim for excellent results in the **SSC Board Examination** left a deep impression on the young minds preparing for their future.

Musi River Overflow – Community Relief and Support:

On 26 September, the Musi River overflowed after relentless rains, bringing severe disruption across Hyderabad. Houses, bridges, and places of worship were submerged, and many families in Moosanagar lost their belongings in the rising water. As the flood level reached nearly five feet around our premises, more than 100 affected residents were sheltered on the first and second floors of our school. With the support of Don Bosco Provincialate, Hyderabad, Little Flower High School, Abids, and Little Flower Junior College, Uppal, dry ration kits were prepared for 900 affected families. The distribution was organized at Little Flower High School, Abids, and coordinated by our staff, helpers and local slum leaders. We appreciate the noble spirit shown by the Salesian Fathers, Local CRI Unit,

Brothers, students and staff of LFJC and LFHS, many of whom contributed clothing, dry rations and even half-day salaries to support the poorest families in crisis.

School Bags and Study Material for Students

Educational needs were also addressed promptly. We remain indebted to Rev. Fr. Anthony Madhanu, whose efforts through the Hyderabad Archdiocese Social Service Society (HASSS) ensured 250 school bags and notebooks for our students. Our heartfelt thanks also go to Rev. Bro. Antony P. for his constant support and for offering an additional 250 school bags and books for the children of Moosanagar. Students of LFHS, Abids also reached out personally, distributing materials and interacting joyfully with the children—an experience that strengthened bonds of fraternity and dignity.

On 9 October, Mr. John Hemanth once again extended his kindness by arranging breakfast and ice-cream for every student and staff member. Parents and teachers deeply appreciated his spontaneous gesture, which filled the campus with smiles.

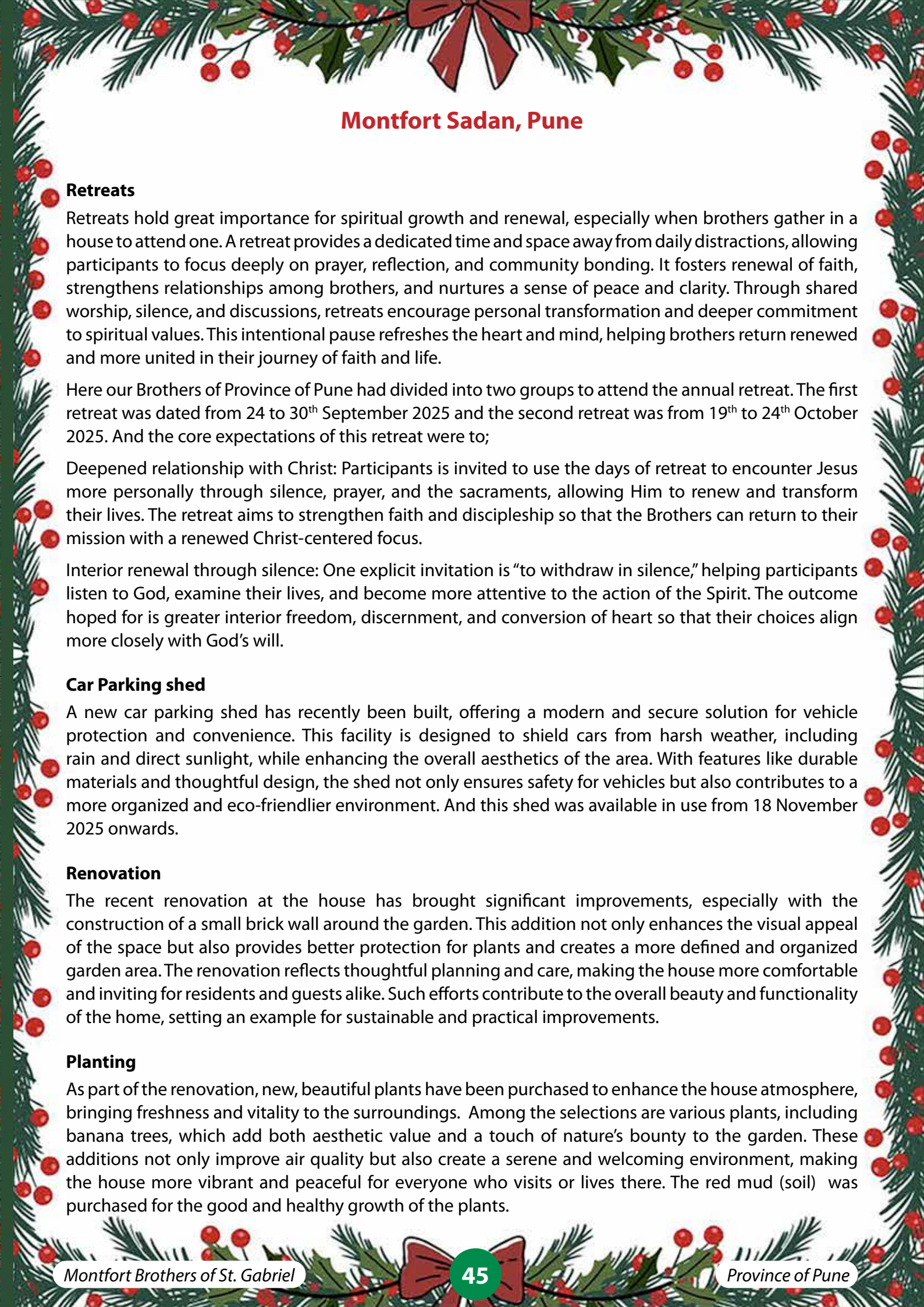
Children's Day Celebrations

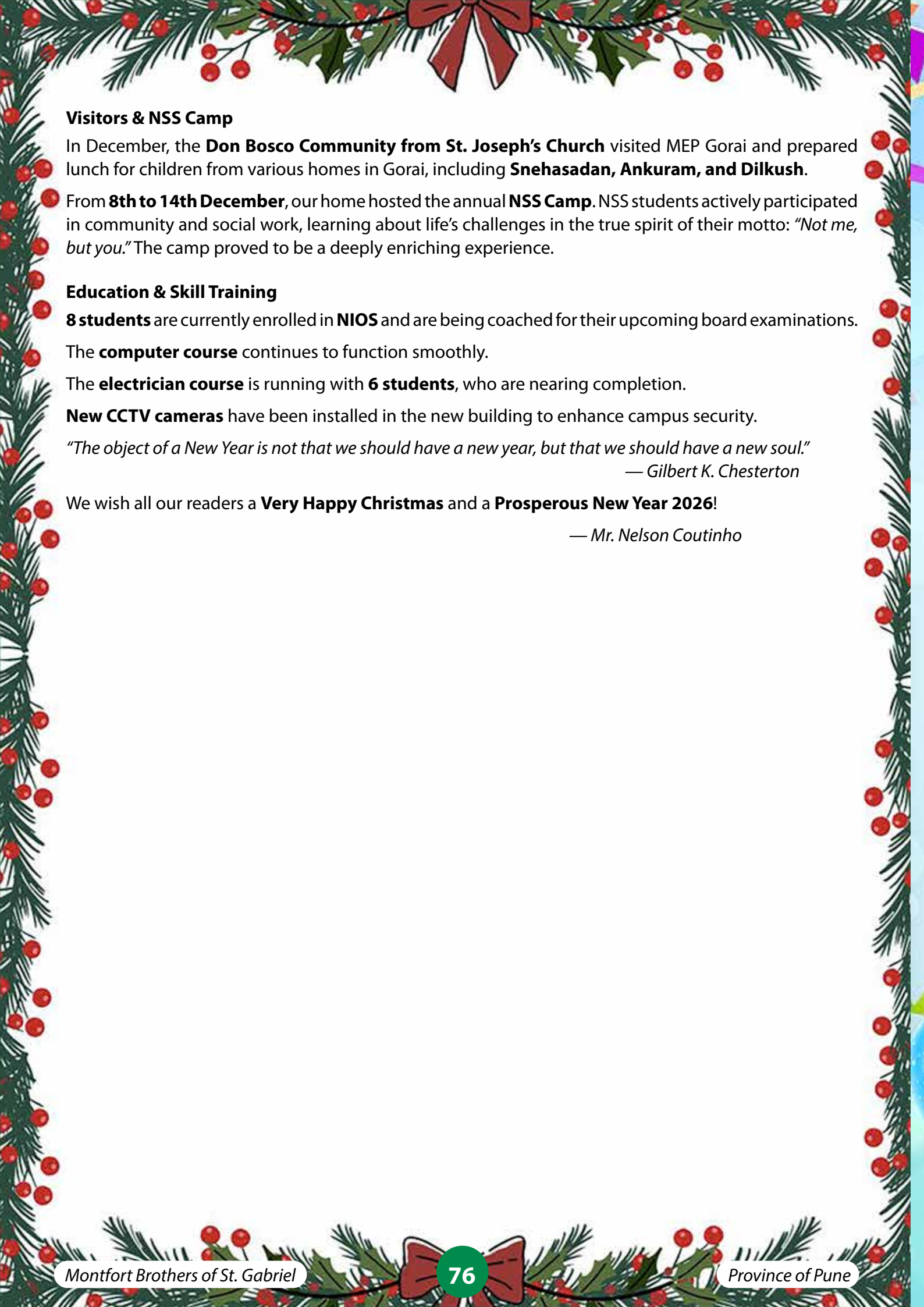
Special Events & Infrastructure Development
